

THE MANOR PARK CLUB : TENNIS SECTION RULES

1. SHOES AND CLOTHING

Recognised tennis shoes only are to be used on the courts please --- NOT ridged or studded soles or dark coloured trainers/boots etc as these damage all surfaces. Recognised tennis clothing is to be worn on court.

2. COURTS NOT IN USE

If nets are not up this means that the courts are **NOT IN USE**. This applies to all surfaces. Disconnected nets must not be re-erected --- they have been left down for a reason.

3. SYNTHETIC CLAY COURTS

Members are asked to sweep the synthetic clay courts after playing on them and to use the line brush to clear the lines.

4. COMPLAINTS ABOUT COURTS

Any complaints, problems or difficulties relating to the availability or condition of courts must be put to either the Club Manager or the Tennis Section Chairman, or if neither is available, to a Committee Member for further action.

5. KEYS AND SECURITY

Access to the Clubhouse and to the indoor tennis centre is by means of a keypad. The respective codes are given in the payment confirmation email sent to members and should not be divulged to non-members. A court key is needed for access to the grass, synthetic clay and acrylic courts. It may be obtained from the club office or from the Membership Secretary subject to a refundable deposit of £5. Please ensure that all doors and court gates are kept closed and locked at all times to prevent access by non-members.

6. COURT BOOKINGS

Members are encouraged to book courts online on the club website or by use of the Booker App. In case of difficulty please contact the club office. There are block bookings for club matches, tournaments, designated coaching groups and regular club rotas. Players using a court but who have not booked have no priority over members who have booked.

7. MEMBERSHIP IDENTIFICATION

Players may be asked who they are and about their membership status at any time.

8. COURTEOUS BEHAVIOUR

Members are asked to display courtesy on court and off court. To make a complaint about the conduct of a club member a member should consult the Club Manager for onward referral of the issue to the appropriate club committee.

9. VISITORS FEES

Please ensure that visitors using the club courts pay their court fees (maximum of three visits in one season accompanied by a Club Member, except when professionally coached). The fee is £5 per adult per session, £2 per junior per session. Please use the Visitor's Book in the Clubhouse Bar and put the fee in the club letterbox in an envelope available in the Café/Bar.

10. PUBLIC COURT ACCESS

Public court access for 'Pay & Play' is offered on the acrylic courts. The cost is £10 per court per hour. Acrylic Court 10 can be booked online through the ClubSpark Booker App or through the Club Office or Café/Bar.

11. JUNIOR USE OF COURTS

Junior members can book courts online but all those under the age of 13 are to be supervised by an adult on court at all times.

12. INJURY/LOSS/THEFT

Members or visitors leaving vehicles, rackets, clothing or any personal possessions at the Club or within its grounds do so entirely at their own risk. The Club does not accept responsibility for any loss, theft, damage or injury arising therefrom.
